

How *IIP Donors* Helped Build a *Palliative Care Centre* in the West of Ireland.



Some investments are measured in returns. This one is measured in the comfort of a family's final weeks. The **Mayo Roscommon Hospice** is the kind of work the Irish Immigrant Investor Programme makes possible, and the kind Eterna places its clients' endowments behind.

The Project

The Mayo Roscommon Hospice Foundation is a registered Irish charity. For 30+ years it has funded palliative care, free of charge, for patients with life-limiting illness across Mayo and Roscommon. It builds and owns its facilities. The project Eterna's clients supported is an 8-bed palliative care centre, where patients are cared for with dignity.

For a programme as rigorous as the IIP, this is why it qualified. Its board is local, its accounts are independently audited, and it holds no relationship with the investors who funded it. That independence is what the Department of Justice requires.



What the Endowment Built

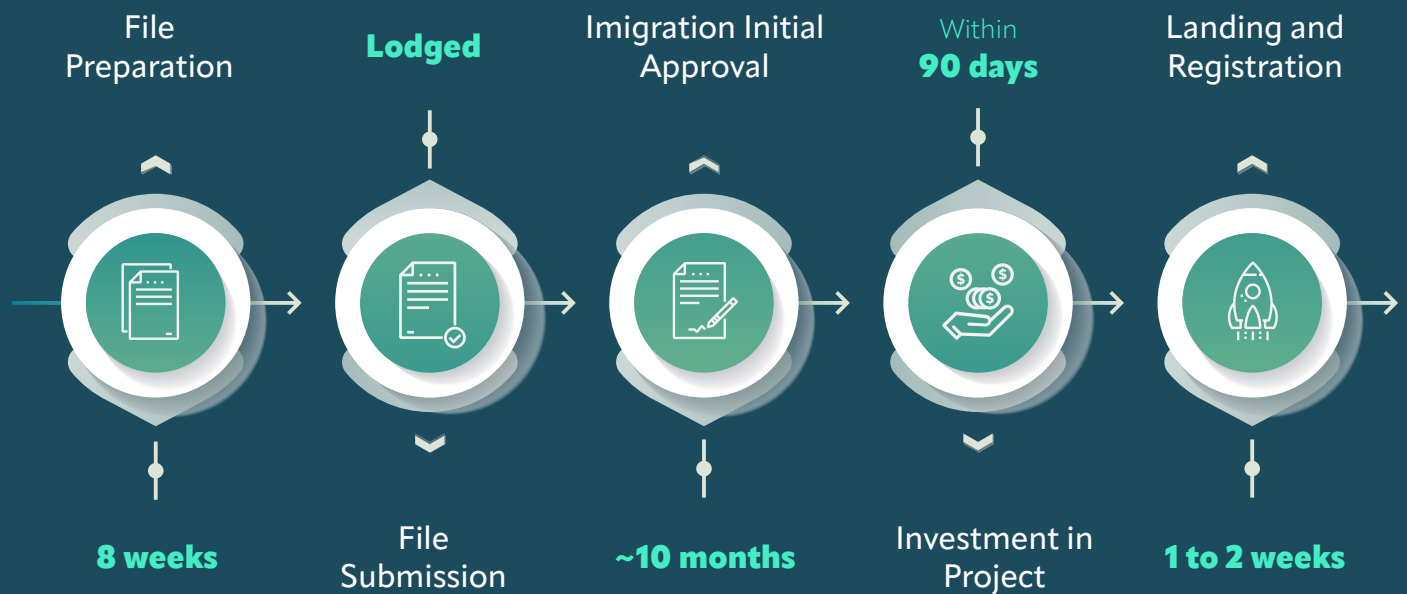
Six donors directed their endowments to this project, contributing **€2.4 million** under the IIP.

The endowment did not fund a balance sheet. It helped build a specialist eight-bed centre with full day-care facilities, in a region that for years had to send its palliative patients elsewhere. It provides inpatient beds, day-care, and respite for those with life-limiting illness. The Foundation built it on land it purchased and owns it outright.

The people who benefit are families in Mayo and Roscommon who now have specialist care close to home.

What it Meant for the Client

For each of the six donors, the same endowment secured Stamp 4 residency in Ireland for their whole family, including dependent children. That residency carries:

- **One of the world's strongest passports:**
Visa-free access to 180+ countries, with full rights across the EU.
- **The only EU citizens who can live and work in the UK:**
After naturalisation, Irish citizens hold both EU rights and the right to live, work and study in the UK.
- **One day a year:**
The endowment route asks for a single day in Ireland each year to maintain residence.
- **Citizenship after five years:**
The investor and family hold Stamp 4 and can apply for Irish citizenship after five years.

One decision, two outcomes. A hospice nearer the families who need it, and a future secured for the generation that follows.
